Preface

Use Synchronize Salesforce Contacts with ServiceNow Users to learn how to synchronize Salesforce contacts with ServiceNow users. The recipe is based on REST and SOAP APIs and you use an HTTP request to call the process. This guide assumes that you have an understanding of the Salesforce Connector and ServiceNow Connector concepts.

CHAPTER 1

Synchronize Salesforce Contacts with ServiceNow Users recipe overview


The Synchronize Salesforce Contacts with ServiceNow Users recipe is based on REST and SOAP APIs.

The process is called by an HTTP request with the contact ID as an incoming parameter. After successful initial validation by ID and email, the process gets value from the **ServiceNow_ID** custom field in the Salesforce contact entity. The process then searches for the user by ID in the ServiceNow **Users** table. If the user does not exist in the table, the process creates a user with the **Username**, **First Name**, **Last Name**, **Email**, and **Phone** fields. The process then returns the user ID from ServiceNow.

Prerequisites for creating a custom field in the Salesforce contact entity


To create a custom field in the Salesforce contact entity, perform the following steps:

- 1. Log in to the Salesforce organization.
- Go to Setup > Build > Customize > Contacts > Fields, and then click New.
 The following image shows the New button on the Contacts Fields page:



3. In the **Field Label** field, enter the **ServiceNow_ID** value and save the custom field. You must create a custom field in Salesforce with the **Text** data type.

SaleforceConnectionContact	App Connection	Salesforce connection with the Contact object filter.
ServiceNowConnectionContact	App Connection	ServiceNow connection based on the Table API.
Create ServiceNow User from Salesforce Contact	Process	The process is called by an HTTP request with the contact ID as an incoming parameter. After successful initial validation by ID and email, the process searches for the user by ID in the ServiceNow Users table. If the user does not exist in the table, the process creates a user with the Username , First Name , Last Name , Email , and Phone fields. The process then returns the user ID in ServiceNow.

CHAPTER 3

Using the Synchronize Salesforce Contacts with ServiceNow Users recipe

To use the Synchronize Salesforce Contacts with ServiceNow Users recipe, you must perform the following steps manually:

- Step 1: Copy and access the recipe
- Step 2: Configure and publish the SalesforceConnectionContact connection
- Step 3: Configure and publish the ServiceNowConnectionContact connection
- Step 4: Configure and publish the process
- Step 5: Invoke the process

Copying and accessing the recipe

To copy and access the recipe content, perform the following steps:

- 1. Open the Synchronize Salesforce Contacts with ServiceNow Users recipe and click Use.
- 2. Select the location where you want to copy the recipe, and then click Continue.
- In the Copying the recipe dialog box, click OK.
 It might take some time for the recipe to get copied. You will receive a notification when the recipe is ready for use.
- 4. After the recipe is copied, click **Explore** to access the recipe content.
- 5. Navigate to the project or folder where you copied the recipe or enter the recipe name in the **Find** box. All the assets in the recipe are displayed as shown in the following image:



Configuring and publishing the Salesforce connection

To configure and publish the Salesforce connection, perform the following steps:


- 1. Open the SalesforceConnectionContact connection.
- 2. In the Type field, select Salesforce.
- 3. In the Run On field, select Cloud Server or any Secure Agent.
- 4. In the Authentication Type field, select OAuth or Password as required.

Based on the authentication type selected, perform one of the following steps:

- For **OAuth** authentication, enter values for the following properties:
 - Authentication URL: Endpoint used to make OAuth authorization requests to Salesforce.
 - Token Request URL: Endpoint used to make OAuth token requests to Salesforce.
 - Session Duration: Number of minutes after which the OAuth token expires.
 - Authorize access: Click Authorize > enter Salesforce developer account credentials > click Allow.


The OAuth authentication process starts. You can check the current authorization status in the **Authorization Status** property.

The following image shows the **SalesforceConnectionContact** connection detail page with the authentication type set to **OAuth**:



- For Password authentication, enter values for the following properties:
 - User Name: Salesforce developer account user name.
 - Password: Salesforce developer account password.
 - Security Token: Salesforce security token.

The following image shows the **SalesforceConnectionContact** connection detail page with the authentication type set to **Password**:



Save and publish the connection.

Configuring and publishing the ServiceNow connection

To configure and publish the ServiceNow connection, perform the following steps:

- 1. Open the **ServiceNowConnectionContact** connection.
- In the Type field, select ServiceNow.
- 3. In the Run On field, select Cloud Server or any Secure Agent.
- 4. In the Connection Properties section, enter values for the following properties:

Property	Description
Client ID	ServiceNow client ID to generate a valid access and refresh token. Enter the client ID that you generated under System OAuth > Application Registry in ServiceNow.
Client Secret	ServiceNow client secret that you generated under System OAuth > Application Registry in ServiceNow.

Property	Description
User Name	ServiceNow user name with the security_admin role to generate client credentials in the ServiceNow instance.
Password	Password associated with the ServiceNow user account.
Service URL	URL to access the ServiceNow instance.
Grant type	Grant type that the ServiceNow instance uses to get an access token for third-party clients authorization. Enter the value as password .

5. Save and publish the connection.

Configuring and publishing the process

- 1. Open the Create ServiceNow User from Salesforce Contact process.
- 2. In the Applies To field, select Contact (SalesforceConnectionContact).
- 3. On the Start tab of the Start step, select Cloud Server from the Run On list.
- 4. Optionally, you can change the tracing level from Verbose to None on the Advanced tab.
- 5. Save and publish the process.

Invoking the process

To invoke the Create ServiceNow User from Salesforce Contact process, perform the following steps:

- Open the Create ServiceNow User from Salesforce Contact process and click Actions > Properties Detail
 Copy Service URL.
- 2. Open a text editor and add the Salesforce contact ID value as shown in the following format:

```
<Cloud Application Integration POD URL>/active-bpel/public/rt/<API_name>/ Create ServiceNow User from Salesforce Contact-1/id/{id}
```

3. Open a browser, paste the service URL, and press enter. The user ID from ServiceNow appears.
